Recent Developments in Consumer and Employment Arbitration: Where We Are and How We Got There

Using arbitration to resolve disputes between businesses is centuries old, but using arbitration to resolve disputes between businesses and their customers and employees is relatively new. This latest use of arbitration has become widespread, and businesses now routinely insert arbitration clauses in their agreements with consumers and employees. Leading practitioners -- and the federal and state courts -- are bitterly divided on the legality of businesses requiring their consumers and employees to sign up to mandatory arbitration that would prevent them from, for example, bringing class or other representative actions in court. A distinguished panel of experts debates recent developments in the law of arbitration as it applies to consumers and employees following the U.S. Supreme Court's decisions in *AT&T Mobility v. Concepcion*, 563 U.S. 333 (2011) and *DIRECTV, Inc. v. Imburgia*, 577 U.S. ___, 136 S.Ct. 463 (2015), and the California Supreme Court's decisions in *Iskanian v. CLS Trans. Los Angeles, LLC*, 59 Cal.4th 348 (2014), *Sandquist v. Lebo Automotive, Inc.*, 1 Cal. 5th 233 (2016) and *McGill v. Citibank*, 2 Cal.5th 945 (2017). The panelists also predict how the Supreme Court will decide a trio of cases pitting its decision in *Concepcion* against the National Labor Relations Board's position that the National Labor Relations Act requires that employees be allowed to bring class actions either in court or in arbitration. Finally, the panelists discuss the public policies that underlie arbitration and debate whether the current state of the law serves or betrays those objectives.
